Student Spotlight

Seba P-Parr, Year 8 Student recently represented Surrey at the South East England Sportshall regional finals, where the team finished second, securing qualification for the UK National Sportshall Finals as the fastest runner-up across all regions.

The team then travelled to Stoke-on-Trent for the national finals, where the competition was extremely strong.

Surrey delivered an outstanding performance, finishing third overall and earning a bronze medal. Seba's individual achievements were exceptional, he secured both an individual gold medal and a relay team gold, alongside the team's bronze.

Seba was crowned UK's under 13's Boys National Speed Bounce Champion with an impressive 86 bounces in 30 seconds, and also played a key role in the obstacle relay team's gold medal win.

Beyond the medals, Seba stood out for his encouragement of teammates and excellent sportsmanship throughout.

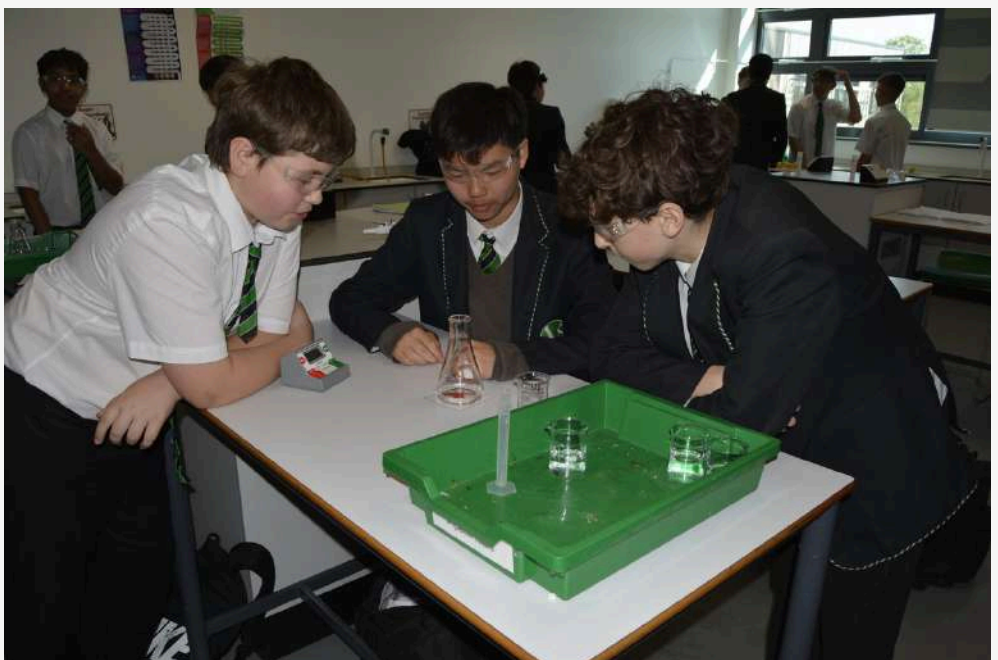
Year Group News

UKMT Maths Challenge

On Wednesday 29 April 60 Year 7 and Year 8 students participated in the UK Maths Trust Junior Mathematical Challenge. The challenge consisted of 25 multiple choice questions which encourage reasoning, precision of thought and fluency. The problems on the challenge are accessible yet still challenge those with more experience.

Hoe Valley recorded the best results that we have ever achieved with 3 Gold Awards, 9 Silver Awards and 24 Bronze Awards.

Three Year 8 Students, A Yip, T Living and C Naia have now progressed to the Junior Mathematical Olympiad.

Look after yourself - sleep, healthy food, and regular breaks are just as important as revision

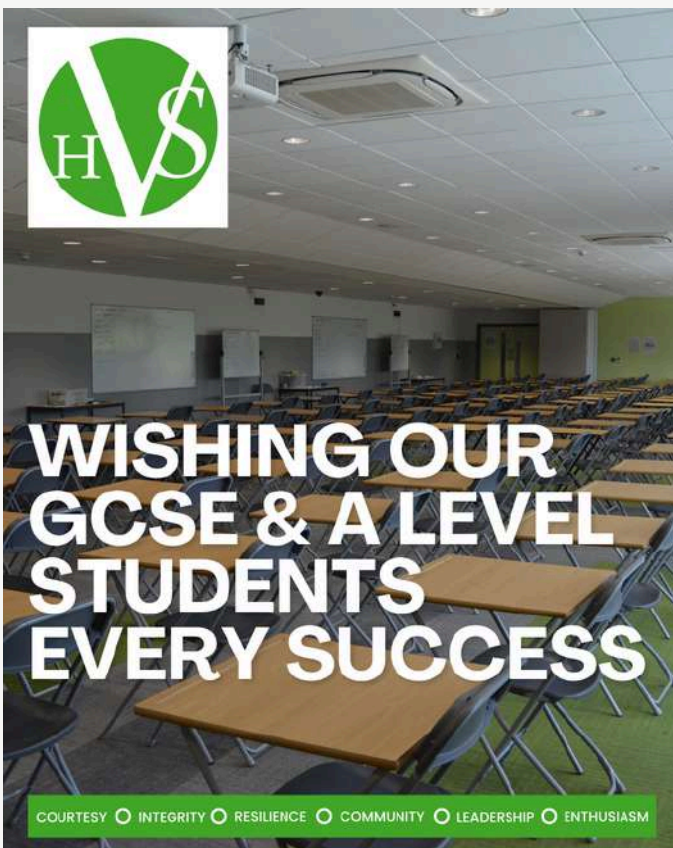
Stay positive - focus on doing your best, not on being perfect. Progress matters

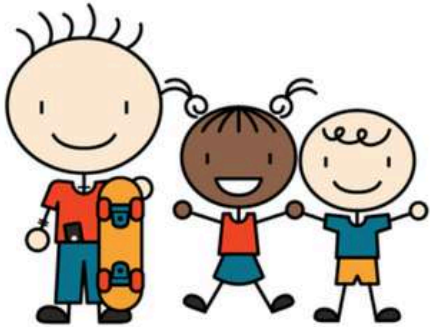

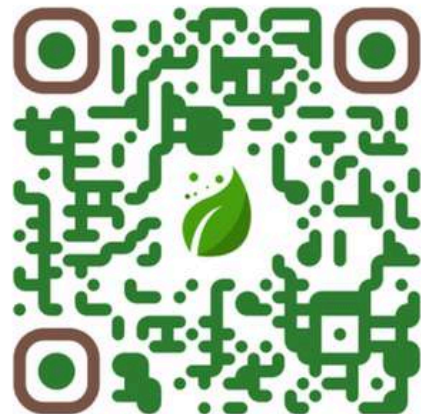
