



HOE VALLEY SCHOOL CATCH-UP FUNDING STATEMENT 2016-2017

“The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve at least level 4 in reading and /or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2).”

Department for Education, November 2014

According to the DFE each school should assess the individual needs of each of the students who attract the year 7 catch-up premium to decide the best way to use the funding and should only select programmes and approaches that are known to be effective.

At HVS, this funding is used for:

- Individual and small group tuition for literacy
- Individual and small group tuition for numeracy
- Bespoke focus groups to boost self-esteem

Total number of students in year group: 120
