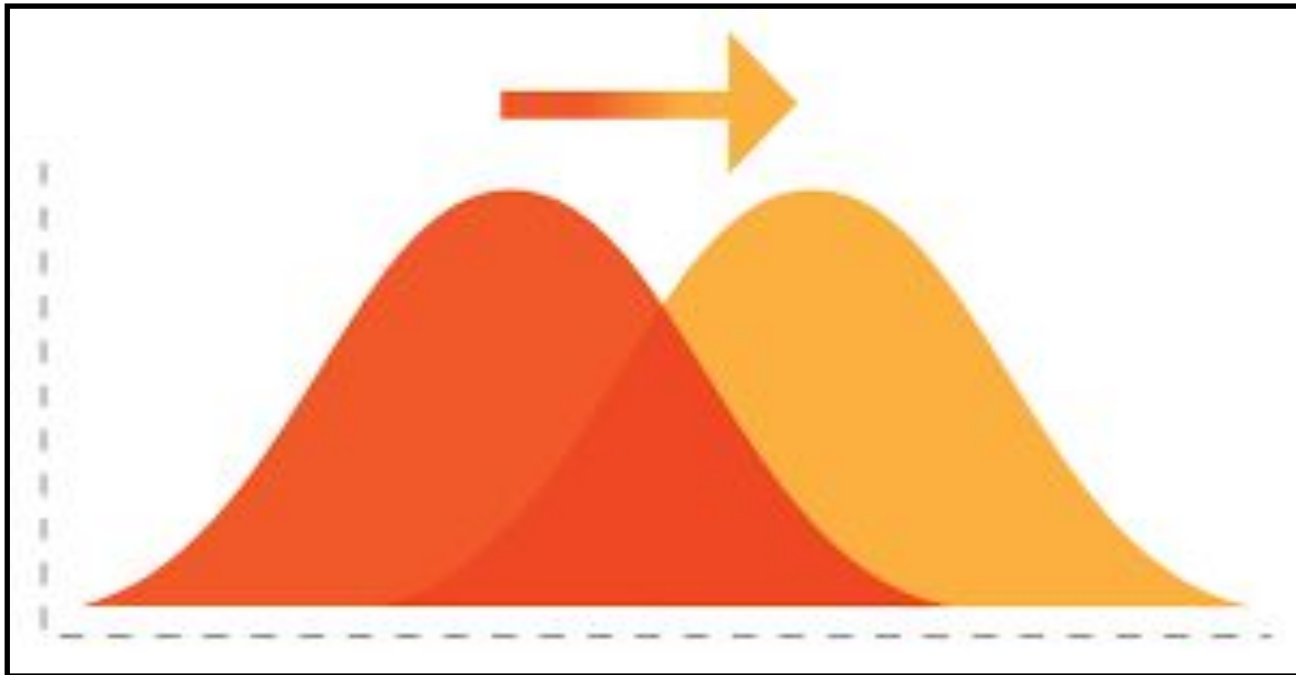

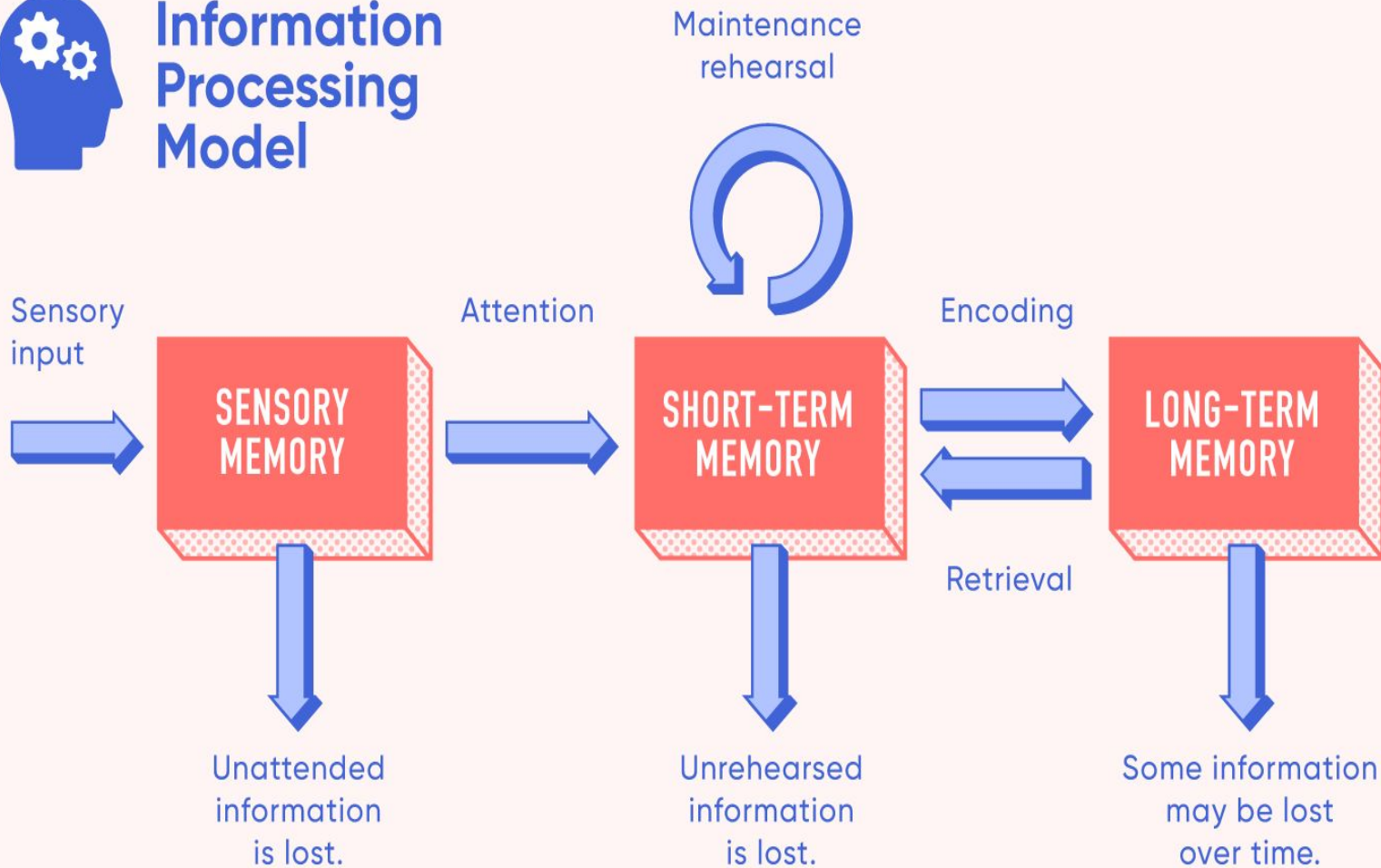

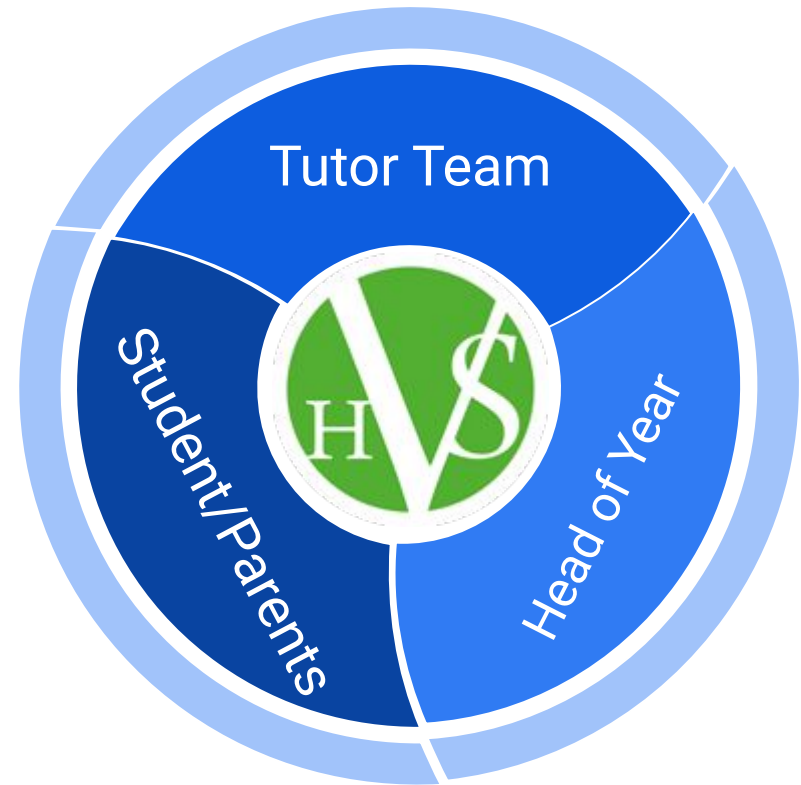

UNIFORM EXPECTATION

STUDENTS PRESENTATION



Hair Cuts

- Sides of hair cannot be lower than a Grade 2.
- Dyed hair of an unnatural colour is not allowed.
- Hair extensions, carvings or styles with dramatic variations in length are not appropriate.

Ear piercings

- Only one stud in each ear lobe.
- No other piercings are permitted

BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

Parent portal

Please can you ensure that you have registered for the parent portal. This is where you will access student reports and other information when required.

If you have not yet registered then please send an email to the following address:

- At the front you will find a tracker sheet.
- This will show your child's grade in each of their assessments.
- Normally assessments are carried out once each term.
 - More frequently in core subjects.
 - Less frequently in subjects they only study once a week or less.
- These assessments will have detailed feedback to help your child learn from their mistakes and improve.
- The tracker will also contain their target for improvement. Get them to explain what this means and what they have done or need to do next.

EFFORT DESCRIPTORS



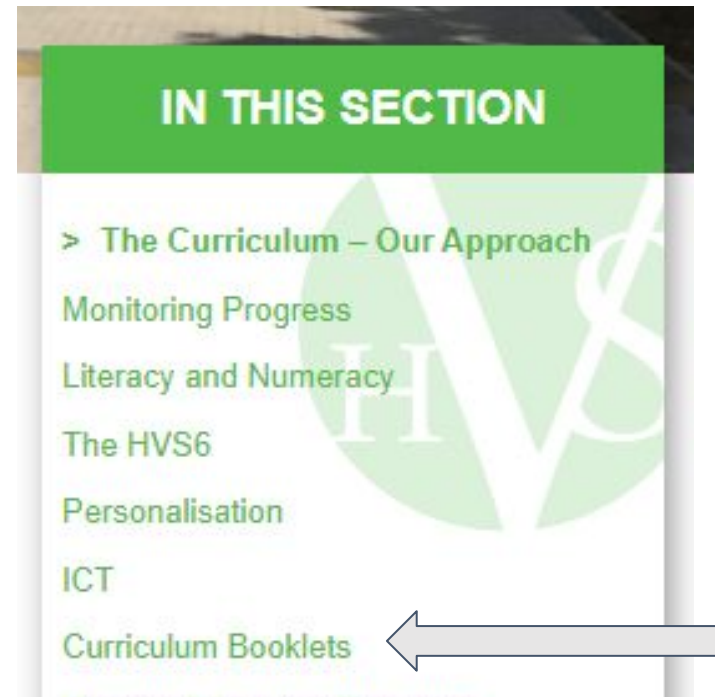
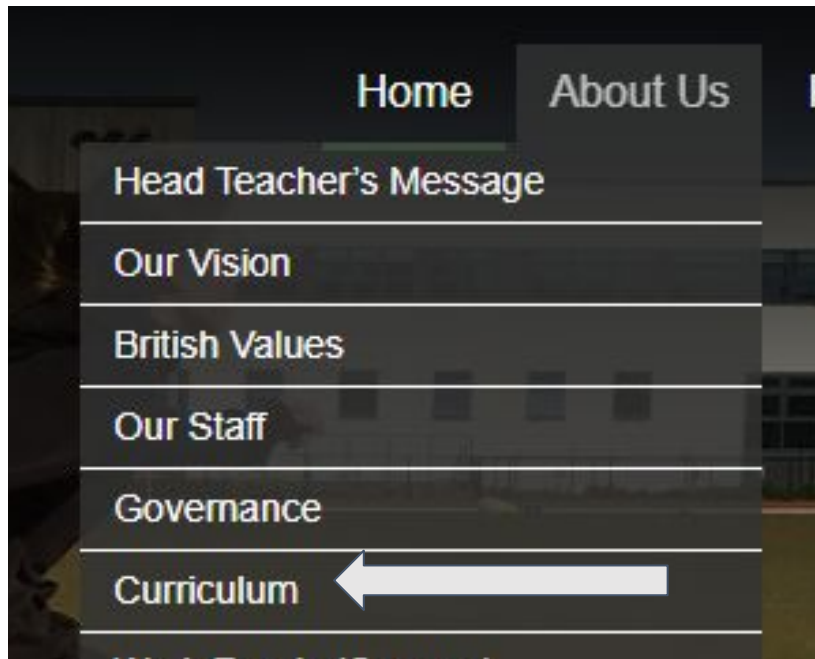
Classwork effort descriptors for KS3 and KS4	
A	Excellent classwork, never off task and work done to their full potential. Regularly seeks extension work and able to work independently for extended periods.
B	Good effort on most tasks and work done to their full potential. Extension work is sometimes completed.
C	Inconsistent effort in lessons, including working below their best. Content to complete classwork without attempting extension tasks.
D	Inadequate effort unless closely supervised with little evidence of work.

EFFORT DESCRIPTORS



Prep effort descriptors for KS3 and KS4	
A	Always completes Prep on time to their full potential. Completes additional tasks at home to extend learning on a regular basis.
B	Usually completes prep on time fulfilling most of the tasks well. Extension work is sometimes completed.
C	Inconsistent effort in prep with mixed quality of work. Whilst it is always completed, it is not always on time.
D	Prep rarely completed at all.
