Students and their families were able to access a dedicated website which included informative videos created by Subject Leads across the school as well as a platform to ask questions directly to the Heads of Faculty. We were so pleased with the success of this evening and the level of student and parental engagement. The taster day on Thursday was also greatly enjoyed by the students. With the Year 8 Parents' Evening coming up on 7th February, we hope that our students feel confident and excited for the next stage of their school journey.

Oxford University welcomed a group of high achieving Hoe Valley students to St Hilda's College on Thursday. The Sixth Form sponsored trip allowed them to sample Oxbridge style tutoring, while meeting current St Hilda's students, and finding out how to get in! 
