The School Charter applies to all three of these groups and is based on the CIRCLE values which ensure that no learning time is wasted during the School day and that students develop self-respect, resilience and courtesy for all.

Courtesy	Show calmness, consideration, professionalism, trust and respect. Treats others how they wish to be treated
Integrity	Fair, honest and trustworthy, commitment to earn success through hard-work
Resilience	Does not give up when learning gets tough, tries their best, accepts consequences of mistakes and moves on
Community	Plays an active part in improving the School community and in the local / global community. Is a positive ambassador to the School
Leadership	Shows leadership in thought and actions. Has high expectations of themselves and others
Enthusiasm	A positive attitude towards life, passion, curiosity and a lifelong love of learning

Courtesy: Reward and challenge students showing courtesy and consideration. Model expectations to students at all times. Explicitly teach good manners and respectful behaviours. Praise courteous and polite behaviour and provide challenge when behaviour falls below expectations. Inform the School each day if your child is absent. Support the School's behaviour and attendance policies.
Integrity: Give honest and constructive feedback. Follow the behaviour policy so that rewards and consequences are proportional and fair. Encourage students to take responsibility for their actions and reflect on triggers for their behaviour.	Be fair and honest. Respect the views and values of others. Accept the consequences for the decisions you make and the fresh start offered. Treat others the way you would like to be treated.	Support the School in giving consequences for behaviour. Encourage reflection at home on why things went wrong. Celebrate successes as a family.
